Its purpose is to promote the sport of pickleball, provide opportunities for members to learn and improve their skills, promote and enhance the enjoyment of social, recreational and competitive play, as well as social pickleball activities, and to work with the local governments to establish policies for the safe and equitable use of facilities. TOURNAMENTS

FEES AT PRAIRIE ATHLETIC CLUB

There has been some confusion about the fees for playing pickleball at Prairie Athletic Club. Pickleball is free for PAC members. You can also play free if you have a membership at Harbor Athletic Club or Pinnacle Athletic Club that entitles you to the use of PAC. Not all memberships at these two clubs allow you to use PAC facilities. SILVER SNEAKER MEMBERS (through health insurance) can become a member of PAC for \$22 a month. This membership entitles you to play pickleball, attend classes, use the pools, etc. PAC will also put your membership on hold (upon request) if you winter elsewhere. The Silver Sneakers membership is a bargain. You could play pickleball every day of the week for free. A 10 visit punch card is available for \$65. This punch card can not be used on weekends and after 4 p.m. weekdays. Pay per visit is \$7.50 weekdays and \$10 for weekends and after 4 p.m. weekdays.

Wednesday – 8:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. (4 courts, all skill levels, mostly beginners/intermediate)

Thursday – 1:00 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. (6 courts, all skill levels)

Friday – 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. (2 courts, all skill levels)

Saturday – 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. (2 courts, beginning 10 a.m. 4 courts)

Please note that there are times when various skill levels may play on separate courts.

TWO COURTS are often available for play for walk-in useage especially during the school year between 6 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

SATURDAY MORNING PICKLEBALL AT PAC

City of Sun Prairie Parks and Open Space Plan Update

On November 10 I was interviewed by the city of Sun Prairie and an outside company regarding the future needs of pickleball and other recreational facilities in Sun Prairie. The city is looking to update the Parks and Open space Plan for the next five years. This plan will provide analysis of city parks and recreation systems and guide future planning for parks and recreation for the next 20 years. During my interview I gave a summary of the different activites that have taken place at the Wyndham Hills outdoor pickleball courts (Pickleball in the Park, clinics, leagues, organized play, open play etc.) I also spoke about the lack of wind screens, the puddle on court two, peeling paint, others using the courts inappropriately, etc. I also talked about the newly organized Capital Area Pickleball Association and their goals for the future. With pickleball being a growing sports and this being a 20 year plan I suggested that the city look into adding 6 additional courts to the current two courts. (Remember this is a 20 year plan). This would allow for outdoor tournaments, players of different skill levels being present at one time, larger leagues, more social activites, city sponsored lessons and possible sharing of the courts with physical education classes. Having lights would also enhance the pickleball courts and useage. I also suggested that the city have an indoor site for pickleball like they do for tennis. I also shared my thoughts on placing a bulletin board at the courts (for schedules, announcements, etc.), posting of rules at the courts (no bikes, skate boards, etc.,).

There is a community survey that you can do regarding the future of parks and recreation facilities. Go to cityofsunprairie.com. You **do not** have to be a resident of Sun Prairie to do the survey. Please support the future of pickleball if you take the survey. You may need to write pickleball in under other. The city will also have two input workshops. Please go to their website for more information.
