FROM THE PRESIDENT

During the last twelve months we have witnessed significant changes to the outdoor pickleball scene. We now have 21 dedicated courts available! With 12 more dedicated courts expected to be completed next year and multiple dual striped tennis courts, the outdoor landscape is looking good. However, we are entering indoor time. Please refer to the website as we update the indoor venues. Some locations are new and others have modified their schedules. The annual CAPA meeting that took place on August 29 marked two full years of our Association. Over 60 members attended to enjoy food and fun (pickleball) as well as getting an update on a broad range of topics.

The following is a quick summary.

By-Law Change – Members voted to allow electronic voting which increased participation in the selection of the new Board with over 100 votes cast online.

Election Results – Joe Carter was reelected Vice President and Warren Luehring was re-elected Treasurer. Karen Jerg and Angie Stone were elected Board Members at Large.

Appointments – With the resignation of Pat Fleming, Joanne Crapisi was appointed Secretary. Fiona McTavish has been appointed Program Coordinator.

Membership – Membership continues to grow. Currently there are over 325 members and we expect it to reach 400 by year's end. Please continue to encourage anyone you play with to join!

Administration – Joe Carter has added many features to enhance the benefits of membership. An online payment system and Sign Up Genius to register for CAPA events are huge improvements. Many of you also took advantage of the CAPA shirt ordering process on the website.

Financial – We enter a new fiscal year with a balance over \$3000. Membership dues are the primary source of income. Social events, technology upgrades, and fees are the major expense categories.

Community News – Karen Jerg reported on the four new courts at Wyndham Hills (see page 3). Janice Kellogg explained the delays on the Stoughton courts project. Mike Barone announced the major project underway in Oregon (see pages 4-5).

DO YOU KNOW THE RULE?

Scenario: The ball bounces on your side of the court and your partner successfully returns it but after contacting the ball his paddle slips out of his hand and lands in your non-volley zone. Do you keep playing or is this a fault that stops play? How about if his paddle continues to slide into the net? We all know that a groundstroke is hitting the ball after one bounce (3.A.13.) And 3.A.37 defines volley: "during a rally, hitting the ball while in the air, before the ball bounces." The controlling rule is 11.H: "Items on the Court. If any item a player is/was wearing or carrying lands on his/her side of the court, unless the item lands in the non-volley zone as a result of a volley, the ball remains in play even if it hits the item." In the scenario above, the paddle landing in the non-volley zone was not the result of a volley, therefore, play continues. However, if the dropped paddle touches the net system while the ball is play, it is a fault and play is stopped. A fault will be declared for the following: 7.F. "A player, a player's apparel, or a player's paddle touches the net system when the ball is in play." The complete 2018 USAPA Tournament Rules Book is available for free download.



On Monday, September 17, about 60 people attended the ribbon cutting ceremony for the four new courts in Sun Prairie at Wyndham Hills Community Park. These additional courts bring the total number of courts to six. Cutting the ribbon were city officials, city council members, and Sun Prairie Park, Recreation and Forestry Commission members. Rico Goedjen, President of CAPA, gave a brief talk thanking the city officials and community for their investment in these courts and the sport of pickleball. With the encouragement and assistance of Mike Derr, the city administrator, an alder and other city employees got on the court and enjoyed a game of pickleball. CAPA had a table where they provided refreshments, registered new members and answered questions that the public may have had. The courts were funded by an anonymous donation of \$85,000, individual donations totaling \$4,500, and the city which provided the rest of the funding. Many thanks to all the donors, the city of Sun Prairie, and Karen Jerg for making this project possible.



SKILLS, DRILLS AND MINI-TOURNAMENTS

Thanks to the many CAPA members who volunteered to either be an instructor or to be a tournament director. The Skills, Drills and Mini-tournaments were a huge success this summer.
