DO YOU KNOW THE RULE?

Which Official Rules Say You Can't Hit the Kitchen Line when You Serve?

A rally is started by serving the ball diagonally into the correct service court. Rule 3.A.32. defines service court as the area on either side of the centerline, including the centerline, sideline, and baseline, excluding the NVZ (non-volley zone). Rule 3.A.19. provides that the NVZ is the 7-foot-by-20-foot area adjacent to each side of the net and that all lines bounding the NVZ are part of the NVZ. The kitchen lines (more formally known as the NVZ lines) are parallel to the net, are 7 feet from the net, are 20 feet long by 2 inches wide

and inside the non-volley zones (Rule 2.B.3.). Rule 4.M. says that during the service, it is a fault against the server resulting in loss of serve if: under 4.M.6. - the served ball lands in the non-volley zone. Consistently, if your serve hits the net but goes over and hits the kitchen line (or any other part of the kitchen) it is a service fault and not a service let (Rule 4.M.8.).

Rules referenced are from the 2019 Official Tournament Rulebook.



VILLAGE OF OREGON JAYCEE PARK WEST UPDATE

It looks like the new pickleball courts are moving forward in Oregon! Recently, many CAPA members attended a joint meeting of the Oregon Parks Board & the Village Board where we weighed in on the new Jaycee Park West project. The original concept included 12 new, dedicated pickleball courts. The revised concept includes six new, dedicated courts with lights!

The park proposal, which was approved by both Boards, calls for the Village of Oregon to fund the entire park project under one construction phase with the caveat that the seven sports clubs raise \$500,000 by spring of 2020. Construction of the new park would tentatively start in the Fall of 2020.

The seven sports clubs to date have raised approximately \$140,000 of the required \$500,000, with 1 donor contributing \$100,000!

CAPA MEMBERSHIP

The 2019 membership peaked at 512 members with 93 members joining since July 1. CAPA's current membership is 428 — approximately 17% chose not to renew. 2020 NATIONAL VETERANS GOLDEN AGE GAMES

Will be played in Madison June 23-26, 2020 hosted at Cherokee Country Club. Nearly a thousand Veterans will be coming to Madison from all over the United States to compete in any of 18 different sports. Pickleball is becoming one of the most popular. The 2018 games were held in Albuquerque, 2019 games were in Anchorage, and the 34th annual games will be played in Madison. The NVGAG is one of the most progressive and adaptive rehabilitative senior sports programs in the world. The Games serve as a qualifying event for competition in the National Senior Games in a number of competitive events. The Games are open to Veterans, ages 55 or older, who receive health care from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.

Competitive events include: air pistol, air rifle, badminton (singles and doubles), basketball (3- on-3, free throw), blind disc golf, boccia (singles and doubles), bowling, cycling, field (discus, javelin, shot put), pickleball, table tennis, golf, horseshoes, nine ball, power walk, shuffleboard, swimming, and track. Local exhibition event(s) are typically offered each year. Tennis will be introduced in 2020.

The pickleball tournament will include: Mens & Womens Doubles and Mixed Doubles; Age Groups include: 55-59, 60-64, 65-69, 70-74, 75-79, 80-84, 85-89, 90+ Volunteers and Referees will be needed. Watch for future notices for sign-up. This will be a great opportunity to support our Veterans.


CAPA PLAYER PROFILES

KEVIN MCPHERSON

Kevin McPherson retired on January 31, 2019 and was on the pickleball court at Hitters the next day. He has been on the courts five days a week for 2-3 hours ever since. He played tennis in high school and lots of ping pong at companies he worked for and credits the other players for most of his pickleball education. Kevin grew up in Wheaton, IL which is a western suburb of Chicago. He received an undergraduate degree from the University of Illinois and an MBA from Northwestern. He was the Chief Financial Officer for a number of technology companies in Chicago, Silicon Valley and Madison.

When Kevin is not on the pickleball court he is involved in several organizations. He is a board member at the Lussier Community Education Center and runs two organizations providing recreational opportunities for adults with developmental disabilities - Just4Fun bowling and LOV @ the Movies.

Kevin's first goal in retirement was to get in better shape as he said he had over 100 pounds to lose. Pickleball gets a lot of the credit for helping him lose the first 65 pounds and he knows it will be a big part of losing the next 50, or so. What was missing for him the last 40 years was exercise that was fun. Pickleball has filled that void for him and introduced him to a group of great people.





NORV BERNHARDT

Pickles, the dog, was responsible for it in 1965, the sunbelt athletes began to experience it in the early 2000's and Norv Bernhardt - with the help of his wife, Carrie - introduced it to Madison adults in 2008. They realized the sport would be fun for all ages and skill levels. Currently, hundreds of people play pickleball in parks, gyms and tennis clubs in Madison and area communities. Norv began by calling on indoor tennis clubs and the Y's asking to use their facilities to set up some courts. He tried Madison Metropolitan School District. Finally, he went to the Salvation Army on whose board he served. With a tepid yes, Norv began the task of taping three pickleball courts at the Salvation Army's basketball facility on Darbo Drive. He and Carrie purchased six plastic buckets, PVC piping, some netting, balls, and a few paddles. They made holes through the pipes to thread the nets and put the poles in the buckets surrounded by stones to hold them up. Alas! They were ready to go.

The Salvation Army opened the gym three days a week from 10-12 except for food basket drives and holidays. The Bernhardts invited friends and after a few quick lessons the fun began. Among the early players, several have won awards in competitions. Others have made lifelong friends and have benefitted from the womderful exercise.
